O'Brien and Cooper win first checks of San Antonio

They are a dynamic duo for a reason.

Clay O'Brien, Cooper and Jake Barnes have won a record seven-world team roping championships together, the last in 1994. Their trails have taken them down different paths, but with Barnes doing the heading and Cooper doing the heeling, they've teamed up again in 2002.

Barnes and Cooper won the first round of the team roping here. They stopped the clock in 5.0 seconds and collected checks for \$3,801 each. The first round of team roping, steer wrestling, calf roping and barrel racing were all held prior to the rodeo performances in slack. Barnes, from Cave Creek, Ariz., and Cooper, from Glen Rose, Texas will be roping their second steer during the rodeo later in the week.

Rod Lyman who has 14 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo qualifications under his belt won the first round of the steer wrestling. Lyman, from Victor, Mont., stopped the clock in 3.5 seconds and won \$4,707. Unfortunately for Lyman, he was not as successful on his second run. His time of 9.8 seconds during the first performance was too long to win him a check and will most likely not make it back for the final round.

Consistency wins world championships in the rodeo arena and Trevor Brazile might be one of the most consistent cowboys roping in the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association. Brazile, from Anson, Texas, won the first round of the calf roping with a time of 7.2 seconds. He just came off of winning the calf roping and all-around titles at the National Western Stock Show Rodeo in Denver where he collected over \$12,000.

Brazile won \$4,565 for his first round calf roping run here. However, like Lyman, he had some misfortune in the second round and is not likely to make it to the finals. Brazile failed to give the calf the required head start on Saturday evening, so he received a 10-second penalty. He would have had an 8.8 second run without the penalty and would have been in the lead in the over-all standings.

He still has an outside shot to win the all-around title here. He also competed in the team roping with Tommy Guy from Abilene, Texas. They had a time of 5.2 in that event which may place in the second round. The all-around title goes to the contestant who wins the most money in more than one event. Brazile's team roping check may earn him the GMC truck that goes to the all-around champion here.

If there is not a contestant that wins money in more than one event, the title and the truck will go to the highest money winner that has competed in two events.

The third performance of the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo will begin at 1 p.m. on Sunday. There will be a 45-foot inflatable television in Bud City on the grounds for spectators interested in the Super Bowl.
