Stalls: Due to the limited number of stalls available, arrival time at Gate A/West Gate will be at 2:00pm one day prior to the contestants scheduled competition time and departure time will be at 10:00am one day after the contestants last scheduled competition time. Eligibility: Cards Only-Limited to 50

Stock Contractor: Various

Ground Rules: Qualifications: Limited to 50. Nine (9) will be selected from 2020 Pro Rodeo World standings based on winnings seven days prior to entry closing. Thirty-seven (37) will be selected from 2019 Pro Rodeo Standings. Four (4) will be selected from the 2019 WPRA Tour standings.

If a contestant's actions are deemed detrimental to the WPRA and/or the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo, or rodeo in general, that contestant will not be accepted as an entry at San Antonio in 2021 and 2022.

The 30 hour replacement policy will be in effect.

No multi-event buddies will be accepted.

Format: Three go-rounds. Back to back to back. (5 brackets of 10 contestants will account for the first 15 performances). The top 4 money winners (20 total) in each bracket will advance to the semi-finals. (Each semi-final round will consist of two performances semi-final 1 performances 16 & 17 semi-final 2 performance 18 & 19). No previous times will be carried forward. If there is a tie, the tie will be broken by any go-round winner in the bracket. If still tied, it will be broken by any single fastest time. If still tied, the tie will be broken based on the 2019 money won.

The qualifiers for the two semi-finals will be seeded as follows:

The actual competition order will be drawn randomly. Qualifying contestants will have until the start of the 5th bracket to trade positions with another contestant from their bracket for the semi-finals. Contestants qualifying in the 5th and final bracket have 30 minutes upon completion of the bracket to change semi-finals. The top 5 from each semi-final (based on total money won from their first three go-rounds plus the semi-finals) will advance to the finals (21st performance). If there is a tie, the tie will be broken by the single fastest time in the semi-finals. If still tied, it will be broken by most money won prior to the semi-finals in the brackets. If still tied, the tie will be broken by any go-round winner in the bracket. If still tied, the tie will be broken based on 2019 money won. No previous times will be carried forward.

The finals (21st performance) will consist of 11 contestants (5 from each of the semi-finals and 1 from Wildcard). The event champion will be determined by most money won in the AT&T Center during the 2020 San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo. If there is a tie, the tie will be broken by the single fastest time in the finals. If still tied, it will be broken by the most money won prior to the finals (bracket plus semi-finals). If still tied, the tie will be broken by any go-round winner in the bracket. If still tied, the tie will be broken by official 2019 money won.

One alley pass per contestant will be available in the Rodeo Secretary's office. Handler is not permitted past the mouth of the alley and designated signage.

Payoff for San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo will be through the WPRA office.

Payoff: All events. No average.

Each performance pays: 1st \$2,500.00, 2nd \$2,000.00, 3rd \$1,250.00, 4th \$750.00

Payoff for each semi-final: 1st \$5,000.00, 2nd \$4,000.00, 3rd \$2,500.00, 4th \$1,500.00

Payoff for the finals: 1st \$15,000.00, 2nd \$12,000.00, 3rd \$7,500.00 4th \$4,500.00

Money will be divided equally in case of splits and any odd pennies will be dropped. Must sign a release of liability with the secretary before competing in this rodeo. No dogs will be allowed on the grounds. All contestants must check in at the West Gate/Gate A on Houston Street upon arrival. Contestants must park horse trailers in the designated Pro Rodeo parking area.

All Contestants with Horses—In-state origin: All horses must have proof of current health papers issued within 30 days, a negative Coggins Test within the previous 12 months, and a vesicular stomatitis statement declaring that the horse did not originate from a quarantined premises. Heath papers for any horse must not expire while horse is on grounds.

All Contestants with Horses—Out-of-state origin: All horses must have proof of current health papers issued within 30 days and a negative Coggins Test within the previous 12 months. Exception: all horses originating from a state currently affected by vesicular stomatitis must have proof of health papers issued within 14 days and a statement declaring that the horse did not originate from a quarantined premises. Heath papers for any horse must not expire while horse is on grounds.

All animals must be compliant with current Texas Animal Health Commission rules and requirements which are subject to change. No exceptions. Contestants must abide by San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo regulations for entry and exit with animals. Individuals who violate animal entry policies will be subject to immediate ejection from the premises.

Any contestant who turns out of San Antonio without a valid doctor release or visible injury will not be eligible to enter San Antonio for a period of two years (will be eligible to return in 2022).

Unruly or unmanageable animals, including contestants' horses that endanger personnel, contestants, spectators, or that disrupt the production of the rodeo may be disqualified by the judges from further use.

Any money won at the San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo, including the qualifier will not count for Texas Circuit Standings or as a Texas circuit rodeo.

Contestants must compete in all go-rounds in order to advance to the semi-finals and/or finals. Any contestant who turns out of any round at the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo without a valid doctor release or visible injury will not be eligible to continue competition, advance to the Semi-finals or Finals, nor enter the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo in 2021 and 2022. If an advancing contestant turns out of the semi-finals or finals for any reason (including a release or visible injury), the contestant who has the next highest earnings in the withdrawing contestant's bracket or semi-final, shall take the available position in that event. If the next contestant is not available, we will move to the next highest earnings winner from the withdrawing contestant's bracket/semi-final until all positions are full.

Entry Fees- There are no entry fees to compete.

QUALIFIER-

A qualifier will be held in the Expo Hall on Monday, February 10th beginning at 8AM and Tuesday, Feb. 11th beginning at 8AM.

The Qualifier and the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo performances will each count as separate rodeos. A contestant who originally qualified for the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo is not eligible to enter the Qualifiers in the same event.

Enter only once.

Entry Fee: \$146 (\$100 + \$21 Procom + \$25 Grounds Fee)

The "30 hour replacement" policy will be in effect.

Cards Only

Limited to 200 total entries (100 each day). Should more than 200 contestants enter qualifications will be based on 2019 Pro Rodeo World Standings.

Qualifier contestants can carry their time to that day's Open 5D race. This can be done at time of online Open 5D entry (www.sarodeo.com/horse-show/entry-forms) or when contestant enters on-site.

All Contestants—All contestants must sign a release of liability with the secretary and be assigned a back number before competing in the Qualifiers.

All Contestants - Contestants must check in with the secretary by 6:30AM prior to the Qualifier beginning at 8AM

All Contestants—Will enter through Gate A/West Gate on Houston Street upon arrival. No dogs will be allowed on the grounds. Contestants must park horse trailers in the designated trailer parking area.

All Contestants—Due to limited number of stalls available, arrival time will be at 2:00 PM one day prior to the contestants' scheduled competition time and departure will be at 10:00 AM one day after the contestants' last scheduled competition time. Stalls are mandatory and are \$40/one-time fee and good for 2 nights.

Contestants may not compete in both the Qualifiers and the San Antonio Rodeo in the same event.

If an alternate for the San Antonio Rodeo who has competed or will compete in the Qualifiers becomes eligible for the San Antonio Rodeo at any point, she must determine which competition she will pursue. Decision is final.

Top 10 times will advance to compete in the Wildcard round on Friday, February 21st. Single fastest time in the Wildcard will be the 11th contestant in the San Antonio Rodeo Finals, with Final positions being random draw. No money will be carried forward from the Qualifier rounds.

If there is a tie for 10th place, tie will be broken on 2020 Pro Rodeo money won. If still tied it will be broken on 2019 money won.

If there is a tie in the Wildcard, tie will be broken by single fastest time in the Qualifier round. If still tied, tie will be broken based on 2019 money won. If still tied, tie will be broken based on 2020 money won.

All events - In the event a contestant who qualified to the Wildcard declines the invitation due to non-acceptance or DO/VIR prior to the Wildcard round, the next qualified contestant (11th fastest time and descending) in that event will be offered the opportunity to advance. This process will continue until all positions have been filled.

Contestants must designate at time of qualification to Wildcard their intent to participate.

All Events—Money will be divided equally in case of splits and any odd pennies will be dropped.

Parking Pass: \$35

Stalls and parking passes are required and can all be purchased upon arrival.

Post at Rodeo—Requested by Committee—Not Enforced by PRCA

1. During Qualifiers, the arena must be clear of all contestants 15 minutes prior to the start of the opening.
2. No timed event contestant is allowed in the arena at any other time than while competing with the exception of a working hazer.
3. No children are allowed in or behind the boxes or in the arena. This is to ensure the safety of contestants, rodeo personnel, stock and children themselves. Violations will result in immediate removal of the premise. No exceptions.
4. All areas behind the chutes and boxes will be considered part of the arena. To gain access to this area, contestants must be dressed according to PRCA rules and have their back numbers visible. Contestants must wear back numbers, which are clearly visible, at all times upon entrance to and while in the arena whether competing or not. No jackets, coats, vests, etc. may be worn covering back numbers while contestant is in the arena areas.
5. Only rodeo contestants with a valid back number will be allowed behind the boxes, chutes and in the chute or arena area. Numbers must be clearly visible. Anyone caught with an invalid number (one not belonging to them) will have that number confiscated. Anyone giving their number or credential to someone else and/or the recipient of the number or credential will be turned into the PRCA Officials and subject to the 2-year ban.
